NEW BUSINESS:

Chairperson Glaser spoke about the current Ordinance 110, Dogs and other Animals. The following volunteers from the Board of Health will review the Ordinance: Johanna Bender, Jeffrey Bresett and Constance Rush. Also included on the committee will be Health Officer Thomas Canistano as well as Animal Control Officer Lisa Perry by invitation by the Board. Councilman Vincent Russo, Chairman of the Borough of Kinnelon Ordinance Committee will be asked to forward each committee member a copy of the changes that the Kinnelon Borough Council would like to see implemented. This is a Borough Ordinance not a Board of Health Ordinance, however, the Board of Health has been requested to also review and suggest changes as well. The newly assigned Board of Health Animal Ordinance Committee will meet and discuss any suggested changes.

REPORTS AND CORRESPONDENCE:

Tim Zachok, Registered Environmental Health Specialist, was not in attendance. Health Officer Tom Canistano gave the monthly report for June 2022.

Health Officer Tom Canistano updated everyone regarding the state of COVID. The BA5 variant is becoming dominant, however, it is not any more contagious than the measles. Subvariants evolve so quickly it can be difficult to develop a vaccine. People can also be re-infected.

Monkeypox, a viral disease, now found in the United States, is similar to Smallpox but not as deadly. The vaccine in New Jersey is very limited at this time.

July 20, 2022

Health Officer Thomas Canistano and Environmental Health Specialist Tim Zachok visited the roadside stand in Fayson Lakes that has been discussed in previous meetings. The property owner has removed everything as this is a zoning violation. The owner was advised that he could approach the Mayor and Council and request a change to the ordinance or he would need a variance from the Board of Adjustment if he wants to continue selling produce, etc..
