Morris County Historic Preservation Trust (large grant money)-Tom Kline: Mayor and Council approved; all materials were sent to NJ Dept. of Community Affairs. They approved; Karen Iuele to run legal ad asking prospective contractors to fill out prequalification package; all submissions due by 6/4. Margaret then reviews and approves the vendors; they are sent the bid package; probably 1st week of July is bid opening. Work probably starting Aug/Sept and hopefully done in 2021.
